Hospitals sold veterinarians their outdated cat scanners and MRI machines, making high-tech medicine cheaper (Burkhard, paragraph 12). Some surgeries cost more than others, but since AMC evolved more, it quickly made vets cheaper by creating the machines; but some people think that while this is ridiculous, what they don't realize is how important animals can be to us. ... He didn't imagine what \$15,000 could buy. He too had come to depend on lady's company (Burkhard, paragraph 25). Shawn Levering, one of Lady's owners, initially thought that the amount of money spent on the Lady was ridiculous, but then grew to realize how much he cared about the Lady. Many people do not realize how much animals can mean to them, and would pay whatever amount of money they would on their own children. Many people find it selfish to put an animal through all the pain of an operation, but really they are the selfish ones who think putting them down would be less painful and more reliable than doing the selfless thing. She grabbed the cut end of Jasper's kidney artery with a dice and pressed it against a tiny hole that she had cut into Lady's as a T-joint in tubes (Burkhard, paragraph 30). Lady may have gone through problems in the operation, and most people would say that animals shouldn't have to go through things like this; but what they don't understand is that this is to give lady another chance, which we should deserve another chance. Pets should be treated as family, not as a piece of property. If someone in your family is sick, you do what you can to get them better: if a piece of property is broken, most throw it out. Following a cat, Lady, through dialysis and a kidney transplant... Lady arrived looking ravaged and adorable, Shawn Levering waited with her at animal medical center on New York's Upper East Side. Supply had come from Wilmington Delaware. Dr. Cathy Langston, the veterinarian explained that Lady suffered from chronic kidney failure and suggested dialysis to buy her time to see if a candidate for transplantation was available, and laid out the risks. The center has eighty-five veterinarians, and each is a specialist. A little more than twenty years ago, all vets were General Practitioners, and castration and spaying were their most elaborate procedures. We're looking at a thousand dollars over the next 24 hours. Between and four thousand in the next week, Langston told Levering. Then Lady would need to be transferred to the University of Pennsylvania, where vets were more experienced at performing transplants. Lady was already anemic, asthmatic, and congenitally blind. She had already become allergic to her own tooth enamel and had all her teeth pulled. Animal Medical Center and The University of Pennsylvania are the Mayo Clinic and Mass General of their field. A.M.C. holds thirteen donor greyhounds and twenty-six donor cats and three ferrets to ensure a steady supply of blood. They often treat exotic, common in New York, where many owners are dog-averse. Director Guy Pidgeon was in practice when most vets were generalists, and have experienced the change. His staff likes to tease him about the time his father, a farmer, came to visit and couldn't understand why he gave oxygen therapy to two prairie dogs. Back home in Nebraska, peasants waged holy war against them. The pet-owners who bring their animals are not dragon-damn who kiss their lapdogs on the lips. Lady's owners, like many in the waiting room, could hardly afford the procedures they buy for their animals. Shawn Levering takes care of the disabled and lives in a three-bedroom apartment outside Wilmington. His wife Karen has been too ill to work after a car accident. Writers visited them in their homes. They have two other cats, which they rescued. Karen describes how the cats comforted her while recovering. I don't know what I would have done without the cats... The pain was so extreme that I was just going to the bathroom and crying. Lady seemed to feel her mood. She would jump on the bed at night and crawl on her chest. Karen suspected that her sense of lady was partially misplaced maternal instincts... Describes the operation where Jasper, the donor cat, has a kidney removed. Dr. Aronson, who is thirty-six, has been transplanting animal kidneys for ten years... Most veterinarians do around sixty thousand a year, and veterinary training can be as costly and rigorous as medical training. Although malpractice suits are rare, that may change. Recently, the owners have sued for emotional damage: a man whose neighbor shot his Labrador retrievers with arrows is suing for three hundred thousand dollars. The more people spend in their pets, the more that cost will be reflected in the law, Georgie Druckler, the retriever-owner's lawyer says. Veterinarians say rising malpractice will harm vets and pass the cost on to the patient's owner... Describes the sometimes extreme measures owners go through to prolong the lives of suffering pets, as with Taberia, a mastiff suffering the final stages of liver cancer... Lady's transplant is successful... The Americans spend 19 billion a year on veterinary bills, up from 11 billion seven years ago...
